We have also committed to build, refurbish, model and equip specialized health facilities so that they may be more responsive to the needs of the community. In addition, we shall also expand training of health workers through provision of scholarships.

I thank everyone who supported and participated in the 5th Edition of the Beyond Zero Half Marathon 2020 from the bottom of my heart.

Post COVID-19, I am confident that Kenyans' resilience, spirit and love of community will be one of the benefits that come out of this season. This will help us move forward together.

#### COUNTING THE FRUITS OF BEYOND ZERO HALF MARATHON

he Beyond Zero Half Marathon has been on Kenya's athletics calendar since 2014. The marathon which was unveiled under the auspices of the Beyond Zero Initiative has been instrumental in improving healthcare for thousands of households in Kenya.

Five years ago, when Her Excellency Margaret Kenyatta, the First Lady of the Republic of Kenya set off on this journey, 5,500 Kenyan mothers were dying every year while giving life. In the same breath, more than 100,000 children were dying annually from preventable diseases.

To date, that is no longer the story, as the number of deaths have reduced considerably. Proceeds from the marathon have been used to touch lives, one village at a time. These funds have in the process contributed towards efforts geared towards ensuring zero maternal deaths, zero child deaths, a healthy lifestyle for the elderly, zero new HIV infections and zero child marriages.

Looking back at the Beyond Zero journey, it is in the year 2014 when the engine of the first Beyond Mobile Clinic roared. Then, the key to the fully-kitted clinic was handed over to the then Taita Taveta County Governor, Mr. John Mruttu. Handing-over of the first mobile clinic in July 2014 was a precursor of things to come. By the year 2016, each of the 47 counties in Kenya was a proud owner of a fullykitted mobile clinic.

The mobile clinics have been used to deliver essential health services, especially in hard to reach areas. Many families have benefitted from free vaccination, antenatal care and treatment.

As Athletics Kenya, the governing body for the sport of athletics incorporating track, field, marathon, road races and cross countries in Kenya, we are proud to have been part of this journey. The marathon, which also attracts considerable number of corporate sponsors and participants has also been used as a qualifier for global races.

The Beyond Zero Half Marathon has also attracted the participation of international champions.

This year, the marathon winner (21km men category) was the 2019 Amsterdam champion, Mr. Vincent Kipchumba. He was actually using

the race to boost preparations for the London Marathon which was cancelled as a result of the Coronavirus pandemic. The 21km women category was won by Ms. Lydia Njeri, another world champion. She was preparing for the Paris Marathon which was also canceled owing to the same reasons

Besides being a training ground for both established and upcoming athletes, the marathon plays a major role in the country's efforts towards inclusivity as it incorporates all participants, including children, pregnant mothers, the visually and physically impaired.

As Athletics Kenya, we are proud to be associated with this project, which is spearheaded by the First Lady.

We are committed to continue offering technical support for the marathon, and are therefore looking forward to being part of many more Beyond Zero races, knowing that they transform lives.

## THOUSANDS TURN UP FOR 2020 BEYOND ZERO HALF MARATHON





his year's Beyond Zero Half Marathon was successfully held on the 8th of March; bringing together over 15,000 participants who turned up to run for a worthy cause under #IWillRun.

The Initiative, which is a brainchild of Her Excellency Margaret Kenyatta, the First Lady of the Republic of Kenya, featured different race categories which included; the 21km half marathon, the 10km road race, 5km family fun race and the 2km pregnant walk.

The winners of the elite categories were Vincent Kipchumba and Lydia Njeri for the 21km men and women race respectively while Vincent Yegon and Everlyn Chirchir carried the 10km men and women elite races respectively. The winners of the 21km elite race for both men and women took home KShs 250,000 each while the winners of the 10km elite races pocketed KShs 100,000 each.

In other races, Ronald Wafula was the winner in the men's 21km tricycle event while Jane Kerubo took the honours in the women's event. In the 21km wheelchair event, Caleb Odio was the winner in the men's event while Caroline Wanjira was the lady winner in the category.

Corporate teams participated in the 10km road race category which saw horticulturists Timaflor emerge winners followed by the Kenya Broadcasting Corporation (KBC) and Minet in second and third place respectively.

Pregnant women were also not left behind as they took part in a 2km walk. Beatrice Chiliswa, Dorcas Moraa and Susan Muthoni completed the podium for the category.

Proceeds from this year's marathon will go towards holding five free Medical Safaris in different counties across the country following the success of five such Medical Safaris that have been held in Narok, Kisumu, West Pokot and Nyandarua Counties with the latest one being held at Uhuru Park in Nairobi in January, 2020.

The Medical Safaris offer a wide range of services to the public including but not limited to issues revolving around maternal and child health.

Speaking during the award ceremony at the Nyayo National Stadium, the First Lady expressed her gratitude to all who supported the Initiative which she says will go a long way in boosting access to health care by Kenyans through the Medical Safaris.

"This event would not be possible if it were not for you and the many other partners who have over the years given us their unwavering support and cheered us on."

"Our work requires knowledge and awareness sharing, so that all citizens can make better health choices and so that women, men and children can access quality and affordable health care. These marathons have made it possible to contribute to Kenya's health care reforms," she added.

Unlike the previous editions, this year's participants were to select one unique cause to support in the broad subject of maternal and child health which included running in support of the fight against Female Genital Mutilation (FGM), child marriages, maternal and child deaths as well as new HIV infections while also advocating for early screening for cancer, acceptability of children living with disabilities, a healthy lifestyle for the elderly and encouraging men to be active players in addressing maternal health.

The Beyond Zero Half Marathon which was launched in 2014 by the First Lady has a long-term goal of completely eliminating preventable maternal deaths by advocating for improved maternal and child health care.

































#### TOUCHING LIVES: THE BEYOND ZERO JOURNEY



In 2013, the survival rates for expectant mothers in Kenya was low, and the prevalence of mother to child transmission of HIV was an urgent issue. Then more than 5,500 Kenyans mothers were dying while giving life to the next generation, and more than 100,000 children were dying from preventable diseases.

It is at that point that the idea of the Beyond Zero Initiative, which is a charitable trust, was conceived by Her Excellency Margaret Kenyatta, the First Lady of the Republic of Kenya. In her quest to reduce preventable maternal deaths and infant mortality, the First Lady committed to heighten advocacy

around the health challenge.

She was inspired by concern on the gravity of the numbers of maternal and child deaths, and a realization and knowledge that these deaths were preventable.

Beyond Zero is a call to action for policy prioritization and formulation, increased resource mobilization, improved service delivery and better individual health seeking behaviours and practices.

Through this high level advocacy platform, the First Lady leverages on the convening power to focus on key challenges facing Kenyans and building strategic partnerships that will address these challenges.

The Beyond Zero Half Marathon has been used to raise funds for the Initiative. At the onset, the funds raised went towards the purchase of 47 fully fitted mobile clinics that were distributed to all counties.

Efforts by the First Lady have borne fruits, as over the years, through collaborative efforts between Beyond Zero, its partners and stakeholders in the health sector, the number of new HIV infections among children fell from 13,000 in 2013 to 6,100 in 2017. On the other hand, the number of mothers delivering without the aid of a skilled worker dropped from 56 percent to 34 percent over the same

time. The number of pregnant women who were attended to by a skilled health worker during delivery doubled from 600,000 to 1.2 million; while the rate of maternal deaths per 100,000 live births dropped from 488 to 362. In addition to the above, the mortality rate for children under five years, per 1,000 live births, dropped from 74 to 52.

The Beyond Zero Initiative has enhanced the profile of Kenya in its efforts to expand access to maternal, newborn and child health; while convening multi-disciplinary stakeholders for resource mobilization.
Additionally, the Initiative has mobilized communities and created awareness for accelerated reduction of HIV, maternal, newborn and child deaths.

In 2018, Beyond Zero launched the 2nd Strategic Framework expanding and deepening its work around neglected issues around maternal and child health. The Framework covers nine intervention areas focusing on promoting access to quality maternal and neonatal healthcare services, advocating for repair and reintegration of women living

with obstetric fistula, promoting good nutrition for all children and advocating for social inclusion of children living with disability for their equal access to health and education services. It also focuses on increasing engagement of men in the reproductive health for their own benefit and that of their families.

Looking at the steps taken so far, many lives have been transformed, and impacted. In the near future, many more families are set to benefit from quality healthcare services.








#### BEYOND ZERO HOLDS FIVE SUCCESSFUL MEDICAL SAFARIS

The successful Medical Safaris have been held in Nairobi, Narok, Kisumu, West Pokot and Nyandarua, with more than 30,000 households benefitting from free medical screening and specialized services.



ince 2018, Her Excellency Margaret Kenyatta, the First Lady of the Republic of Kenya has led the Beyond Zero Initiative in holding five Medical Safaris across the country.

The First Lady is the patron of the Beyond Zero Initiative which was launched in 2014

Medical Safaris are large-scale outreach programs conducted in collaboration with the County Governments and over 15 medical service providers.

The successful Medical Safaris have been held in Nairobi, Narok, Kisumu, West Pokot and Nyandarua, with more than 30,000 households benefitting from free medical screening and specialized services.

Services provided during the Medical Safaris included free cardiovascular and cancer screening, screening for eye care clinic for elderly persons, orthopedic clinic for children, assessment and registration for children with disabilities, check-up for pregnant mothers, screening for hearing loss and oral health screening.

Additional services which were provided at the Medical Safari included diabetes and hypertension screening, HIV counselling and testing, immunization, Linda mama registration for all pregnant mothers, National Hospital Insurance Fund (NHIF) membership registration and blood donation.

While launching the 5th Medical Safari in Nairobi on January 23rd, 2020, the First Lady announced plans to hold four more Medical Safaris this year targeting at least 50,000 households with free and quality healthcare.

The idea of the Beyond Zero Initiative, which was conceived in 2013 by the First Lady, is committed to heighten advocacy around reducing preventable maternal and child deaths.















#### KIBIBI FROM RIRUTA VILLAGE GETS A FREE PAIR OF READING GLASSES

On January 24<sup>th</sup>, 2020 Ms. Kibibi Nyambura was one of the beneficiaries who attended the free Beyond Zero Medical Safari held at Uhuru Park grounds in Nairobi.

She came to the Safari for an eye check-up, as she could not see or read properly.

After a series of eye tests conducted by VisionSpring, one of the partner organizations at the Medical Safari, her ailment was identified - she needed some medication and a pair of glasses to correct her eye condition.

"I have been given eye medication and spectacles. Now I am able to see properly and read too. Before I could not. I am so happy with the assistance that I have received today," she said.

Nyambura noted that there were several tests being offered for free including cancer and blood pressure.

She expressed gratitude to Her Excellency, Margaret Kenyatta the First Lady of the Republic of Kenya, Margaret Kenyatta, urging her to continue with the good work.

"We are solidly behind you, keep up with the good work, she said.

During the Medical Safari in Nairobi, more than 2,810 individuals benefited from free comprehensive eye screening. More than 1,400 patients received free reading glasses, and 74 cataract cases were detected.

She could not hide her joy when the boy was fitted with a hearing aid from Starkey Hearing Foundation.

"My kid who had hearing problems has been assisted for free and I am so happy about that. I urge anyone with a kid who has hearing problems to also bring them to these Medical Safaris when they happen and they will be assisted like I have," she beamed with joy.

Starkey Hearing Foundation was at the grounds to offer hearing screening for all.

The mother further expressed her gratitude to Starkey Hearing Foundation and Beyond Zero for giving her son the chance to be able to hear again. He suffered hearing loss after an illness

So far, more than 800 individuals have benefited from free hearing screenings conducted in Kisumu, Nyandarua and Nairobi Counties.















































## HUNDREDS RECEIVE FREE CANCER SCREENING

Cancer screening was one of the most sought after services during the 5th Edition of Beyond Zero Medical Safari that took place between January 22nd and 24th at Nairobi's Uhuru Park.

The Medical Safari coincided with Kenya's national cervical cancer awareness week.

During the Safari, 1,674 individuals were screened for cervical and prostate cancer. Partners offering the free screening services were Beth Mugo Cancer Foundation, Africa Cancer Foundation, Women4Cancer, Kenyatta National Hospital and County Government of Nairobi.

At the Medical Safari, 17 cases of suspicious cervical cancer were detected and 11 patients were treated using thermocoagulation. According to Africa Cancer Foundation Programme Manager, Ms Wairimu Mwaura, thermocoagulation is a technology approved by the World Health

Organization (WHO) for usage in low and middle income countries. It is a one minute procedure which uses heat of about 100 degrees to treat lesions.

The Beyond Zero Initiative creates awareness about early cancer screening and also encourages regular cancer checks.

Globally, millions of patients are fighting cancer. Early cancer screening is an important aspect in the treatment of the disease.

Cervical cancer has been termed to be one of the major challenges in achieving maternal health. Early cancer screening is one of the causes participants in the Beyond Zero 2020 Half Marathon can choose to run for.







## MORE THAN 1,200 DIFFERENTLY ABLED PERSONS REGISTERED

The Beyond Zero Initiative, working in conjunction with the National Council for Persons with Disabilities (NCPWD) has facilitated assessment and registration of 1,205 differently abled persons.

These registrations have been carried out in five counties where the Initiative has so far conducted Medical Safaris. These counties are; Nairobi, Kisumu, West Pokot, Nyandarua and Narok.

Assessment and registration of persons living with disabilities resonates with efforts across the globe geared towards promoting the wellbeing of vulnerable groups, including individuals who are differently abled.

These efforts are aimed towards giving differently abled individuals opportunities to participate effectively in all spheres of life, in the process entrenching inclusivity.

During the Medical Safari held in Nairobi's Uhuru Park, the Beyond Zero team caught up with one of the beneficiaries.

An elated Peter Njoroge\* could not hide his joy. In a brief interview, he said he was involved in an accident

which led to the loss of his leg.

"I came here because of my disability. I broke my leg about five years ago and until now I am still suffering. I just came here today to have my leg scanned. Following the accident, I have not been able to continue working as I used to before."

He said he had been served well, and was waiting for a physiotherapist to look through photos of the scanned leg and guide him on the next steps.

"I urge Her Excellency the First Lady, Margaret Kenyatta to continue with this Initiative because it is helping many people who are not able to raise the monies required in hospitals to get treated. Under this program, one gets treated for free and I am so happy about that, and also hope for the best," he said with finality.



Female Genital Fistula (FGF) is a condition that many women in Kenya have suffered from, some in silence. It brings about shame and deprives women of their dignity.

According to Amref Health Africa, fistula mostly occurs as a result of prolonged obstructed labour, coupled with lack of skilled medical care. It usually leads to a continuous leakage of urine and/or stool and loss of control of bowel movements.

The organization further states that in Kenya, it is estimated that for every 1,000 births, two women get fistula, resulting in 2,400 cases every year. Sadly, the capacity to provide fistula repair services is less than 50 per cent of the new cases every year. Kenya is therefore in great need of medical personnel trained in FGF prevention, care and treatment.

Beyond Zero Initiative is currently

working with Amref Health Africa to screen for FGF and also conduct surgical repairs for affected women.

The screening and repairs are conducted under the Beyond Zero Medical Safaris, four of which have been conducted in Nairobi, Narok, West Pokot and Kisumu

Under the Initiative a total of 865 women have so far been screened in Kisumu, Narok, West Pokot and Nairobi counties. Through the initiative, there have been 193 free surgical repairs conducted on women and girls in the four counties.

Fistulas affect women and girls in poorer regions of the country who do not have access to professional childbirth resources. In communities where early child marriages and female genital mutilation is practiced, the condition is rampant mostly due to complications that

arise during childbirth.

Many fistulas are cured with a single surgery. In a proper medical setting with a trained provider and adequate supplies, surgeries can yield success rates of over 90%.

The biggest challenge for women is finding a health facility that has a surgeon trained in fistula repair or care. Most hospitals in areas with high fistula rates have very few medical professionals who know the specifics of fistula repair. Due to this, most women end up staying for long periods with the condition.

The Medial Safaris have been instrumental in bridging this gap by bringing healthcare closer to people and to ensure that many people who would have ideally not had the chance for treatment benefit from the same.

## FIRST LADY LAUNCHES THE BEYOND ZERO HALF MARATHON



n December 3rd, 2019, Her Excellency Margaret Kenyatta, First Lady of the Republic of Kenya launched the 5th Edition of the Beyond Zero Half Marathon at State House, Nairobi.

During the launch, which was attended by partners and representatives from various organizations, the First Lady restated her commitment to continue advocating for initiatives geared towards improving provision of quality healthcare to women and children.

She also announced the expansion of the Beyond Zero Medical Scholarship programme from 100 to 200 beneficiaries in 2020. Further, she said the funds raised through the marathon will be used to refurbish health facilities, and also kick-start the process of setting up a specialized Beyond Zero referral health facility.

"Through the funds raised we will continue to be responsive to the needs of communities by rebuilding or refurbishing and equipping specialized health units to serve communities in marginalized areas," the First Lady said.

On the same day, the First Lady and her team of trainers who included world marathon record holder Eliud Kipchoge and his wife Grace started her training for the run, which took place on March 8th, 2020.

Among those who attended the launch at State House were Mrs. Ida Odinga, Sports CS Amina Mohammed, Chief of Staff in the Office of the First Lady Constance Gakonyo, Eliud Kipchoge and National Aids Control Council CEO Dr Nduku Kilonzo.

"Our work is not finished. The worrying trend of increased cancer hurts our families, hurts our communities, hurts our nation. In addition, increase of new adolescent HIV infections threatens to disrupt Kenya's opportunity to reap from our demographic dividend from a youthful generation," Her Excellency Margaret Kenyatta said.

The First Lady expressed gratitude to marathon stakeholders including donors for their continued support, adding that the Beyond Zero Mobile Clinics and the Beyond Zero Medical Safaris had transformed the lives of millions of Kenyans.

The Beyond Zero Medical Safaris which were unveiled in 2018 have benefitted more than 30,000 households, many of them receiving free medical services. Other services offered at the Medical Safaris are advocacy and awareness.

The launch of the half marathon coincided with celebrations to mark the International Day of Persons with Disabilities (IDPD). This day is observed annually to promote the rights and wellbeing of persons with disabilities.

The theme of the 2019 IDPD was "Promoting the participation of persons living with disabilities and their leadership: taking action on the 2030 Development Agenda."

The First Lady noted that the theme resonated with the Beyond Zero agenda of leaving no one behind in access to quality health services.

During the launch, there were eminent panellists who discussed ways and means in which the Beyond Zero Initiative had marshalled the private and public sector to focus on improving healthcare for both women and children.

The panellists included United Nations Resident Coordinator Siddharth Charterjee, Regional CEO of Jubilee Holdings Dr. Julius Kipngetich, Ford Foundation Director for East Africa Maurice Makoloo, Acorn Special Tutorials Centre Director Eva Naputuni Nyoike, Director HSS at Amref Health Africa Dr. Elizabeth Wala and CEO of NACC Dr. Nduku Kilonzo.


























# FIRST LADY FLAGS OFF 100 MEN RUN IN KARURA FOREST, NAIROBI

## Beyond Zero Initiative donates food and non-food items to cushion vulnerable groups during COVID-19 pandemic



Several vulnerable groups have benefitted from donations of food and non-food items and medical supplies over the months of April and May as part of the Beyond Zero Initiative's contribution in support of the national response against the COVID-19 pandemic.

The donation to vulnerable group's prioritised senior citizens, people living with disability, mothers and children from poor and difficult

circumstances in line with the Beyond Zero's Strategic Framework 2018 to 2022, founded by Her Excellency Margaret Kenyatta. The Framework focuses on, among other interventions, improving access to comprehensive health care and social protection for the targeted groups.

The donation began on April 24 at the Nyumba ya Wazee old people's home in Kasarani which received bales of uji mix flour, bags of sugar, boxes of long life milk, beans, gloves, diapers, face masks, hand sanitizers, gallons of multipurpose disinfectants and blankets.

The Nyumba ya Wazee home run by nuns from the Catholic Church's Little Sisters of the Poor caters for senior citizens, both men and women, with the eldest being 106 while the youngest is 78 years old.



The Beyond Zero team led by Ms Jane Kiragu and Ms Eva Maina from the Office of the First Lady was back on the road on April 27 to support St Joseph The Worker, a health centre that serves the low income communities in the outskirts of Nairobi City.

The donation received by Sister Magdalene Mwaura and Father Melchior Marandu included food items, and medical supplies to protect the healthcentre workers including gallons of multipurpose disinfectant, bottles of sanitizers, personal protective equipment (PPE) kits, face masks and an assortment of medical supplies including drugs, syringes and cotton wool.

In her concern for children, the First Lady of Kenya continues to support children facing challenging circumstances. The next donation was to Nyumbani Children's home which cares for HIV positive orphans. The Home touches the lives and hearts of over 14,220 children every year, and offers outreach support to our elderly and vulnerable people.

The donation to Nyumbani Children's home was presented to Sister Mary

Owen on April 28 by Beyond Zero Coordinator Ms Angella Langat who was accompanied by Ms Vivianne Ngugi and Ms Eva Maina, both from the Office of the First Lady.

Sister Mary Owen said the donation has come at the right time and will boost her institution's efforts to provide a dignified life to the vulnerable children.

"I want to thank Her Excellency First Lady Margaret Kenyatta and Beyond Zero for the food support during this time of the COVID-19 pandemic. We are not only grateful for the food donation but also for knowing that you think about us and the children we care for.

"We want to thank you from the bottom of our hearts. May the Almighty God bless you all," Sister Mary Owen said.

On April 30, the Beyond Zero Initiative put a smile on the faces of children at Imani Rehabilitation Centre in Nairobi through a donation of food and non-food items. Established in 1990, the Imani Rehabilitation Agency has grown and now has seven projects caring for over 300 vulnerable children-

some of them as young as a day old - around the country.

Children living with disabilities and their caregivers are facing unique challenges during this COVID-19 pandemic period with their therapy, care and treatment being disrupted.

On May 9, Beyond Zero presented a donation to nine charity and community based organizations that cater for children with special needs and other vulnerable groups which included bales of uji mix, maize flour and boxes of long life milk. Other donated items were sanitizers, face masks, salt, bags of sugar, rice and beans, packets of tea leaves, and cartons of cooking oil.

The nine organizations that received the donation included the hosts Acorn Special Tutorials Centre, Little Rock Centre, Crossing Bridges Ngong Branch and Sweet Aroma which were represented by their directors Ms Eva Naputuni Nyoike, Ms Saturina Orumoi, Ms Lilly Oyare and Ms Grace Maina respectively.

Other beneficiaries included Bringing Hope Charity International, Special Education Professionals, Crossing Bridges Naivasha Branch,



Nongera Education Centre and Nyumba Kumi Gichungo. Speaking after receiving the donation, Acorn Special Tutorials Centre Director Eva Naputuni Nyoike thanked First Lady Margaret Kenyatta and the Beyond Zero team saying the items will not only help the children with special needs at Acorn Special Tutorials Centre but also other vulnerable people in the centre's neighbourhood.



# Equity Afia - Your Affordable, Caring Health Partner



quity Afia was founded in 2015 under Equity Group Foundation's (EGF) Health Pillar, as a franchise of medical outpatient centres to respond to the growing need for affordable and accessible quality healthcare for Kenyans. Its aim is to bring new strategies to provider reform, customer reform and insurance reform.

In Kenya and across the globe, medical costs continue to consume a large share of the household budget. Locally and regionally, the cost of treatment can be too high limiting quality services to people who need them most. To help solve this problem, the Equity Afia medical centres have adopted strategies to enhance access to affordable treatment at the facilities.

For the franchise, access is viewed as two-fold, that is, through the expansion of its medical centres network and by offering affordable healthcare services to citizens everywhere. Additionally, the clinics have standardized their fee's to charge Ksh 500 as the medical consultation fee and at an affordable cost, patients can go through the full evaluation, diagnosis and prescriptive cycle. The clinics have also partnered with various insurance service providers in Kenya, allowing acceptability across diverse consumers, businesses and communities.












# **Bringing Textiles Home**

aving weathered a storm of competition from overseas, Kenya's Thika Cloth Mills is investing in modern techniques to help the national industry stand on its own two feet.

"At the age of 24 my sister and I visited the factory one afternoon to find all the workers standing outside. They hadn't been paid their wages. My father explained that the factory was going through difficult times and that the family was restructuring. He told the workers that the future looked grim and they could either go and look for green pastures or get back to work and hope for the best."

"To our surprise every worker went back into the factory. I knew how much this meant to them, and I made a promise to fight for our people and make this wrong right."

This is Kenya, 1998, just outside of Nairobi – a textile trade in crisis. Huge influxes of cut-price clothing from the manufacturing powerhouses of Asia had penetrated the local market, and decades-old local businesses were under threat.

The opening words are those of Tejal Dodhia, now Managing Director of rejuvenated family enterprise, Thika Cloth Mills.

In order to save her family business in the late 90s, the MD knew a departure from tradition

was necessary. Thika Cloth Mills had to adapt to survive.

"Today we are leaders in the uniform sector, supplying many school distributors, corporates and almost all security uniform materials. Our survival is built on consistent, high quality fabrics, focusing on customer needs and fast deliveries."

Employee numbers have recovered to 650, dedicated and skilled staff who produce goods for around 400 customers across Kenya, from large manufacturers to small-scale tailoring outfits. Thika Cloth Mills also supplies companies whose products reach further afield, both in Africa and to the likes of Europe and the US.

Having appointed a new president in 2012 who aligned with her vision, the MD joined the Kenya Association of Manufacturers (KAM) and became a loyal proponent of the Buy Kenya Build Kenya campaign.

"We would like to thank the H.E the President, The Ministry Of Industry and Kenya Association of Manufacturers for their support which has enabled the company to fast track modernisation," Dodhia adds.

"It is our vision to get back to 2,000 employees and buy cotton locally, creating jobs for many Kenyans. We want to provide quality products that can be converted to garments and fashion items, further creating jobs in this sector.

Further, the Kenya Information and Communications Act (KICA) mandates the Board to enforce the watershed period (5am-10pm) for free to air TV and radio by ensuring that content aired during this period is suitable for all family viewing (General Exhibition).

The Board also registers Film Agents and issues filming licences to filmmakers. Additionally, it gives film/video regulatory licences to exhibitors and distributors of film content as well as classifies content for age appropriateness before exhibition or broadcasting.
